



Walt Kile of Fall Creek Oregon, started riding and building choppers around 1966. "We chopped everything back in those days." Building everything was the only way to customize or build bikes and that's exactly what he did for years. Reinventing everything from drive train components to chassis and then riding the hell out of them. You get the picture of motorcycles getting put up wet, so to speak. The words "old school" doesn't even begin to qualify the scope of the lifestyle and experience that Walt has seen.

Fast forward 40 years and Walt is still living the dream. Riding and building chopped, radical, hand fabricated motorcycles. Walt and his son Josh run Poor Boy Choppers out at his place near Fall Creek. They specialize in one off motorcycle fabrication. Primarily working with Sportsters, hence the name Poor Boy, says Walt. Frames are built and modified, mostly stretched Hardtails and lots of other fabrication too including hand built girders, long glide front ends, tanks, both oil and gas tanks and other sheet metal fabrication as well. Performance is tackled much the same way as he has done it for years "Function over style and whatever makes em go faster and last longer!" It's a turn key operation from design to paint. They build them to order and document with photos and then provide a CD at the end for the customer to see the entire progression.

Josh grew up watching his Dad build, ride and live it and now he puts in his own 2 cents to really add some dimension and insight to their work. He has his own styling and abilities that rounds out their company. "He's a good mechanic and fabricator", says Walt, with a little smile "but luckily he still needs me when it comes to some of the more meatier problems that we come across".
